Impact on development

Job creation

The medical vehicles will contribute to the growth of direct and indirect employment. For each vehicle 2 additional FTE's will be required. Given an standard occupancy of 50%, additional employment for 460 FTE's will be created.

There will also be an increase in indirect employment related to the additional consumption of medical disposables and purchase of medical equipment. Suppliers of these medical consumables will require additional FTE's to process the increased demand.

Increase of production strength

The transaction leads to a transfer of knowledge, skills and techniques to the medical staff that will be operating the vehicles. The exporter will share knowledge with the buyer through training and technical assistance with the maintenance.



Other positive effects of the transactions

In general this transaction will contribute to the improvement of healthcare in Mali. The vehicles will enable cost effective and quick transportation of injured people and pregnant women to medical facilities nearby.

Risk category

The transaction is qualified as a category M-project. The transaction is acceptable.

Description

The transaction involves the supply of 10 Toyota medical transport vehicles and 450 tricycle ambulances, including medical and communication equipment, and work procedures. The exporter will also carry out the transfer and sharing of knowledge regarding the use and maintenance of the ambulances, and corresponding medical equipment. The ambulances meet the high requirements and standards with respect to efficient and hygienic work and will propel the realization of the 'Millenium Goals'. The ambulances will mainly be used for the transportation of patients, medical supplies, doctors and other medical specialists.
