## Impact on development

Job creation

The machines will contribute to the growth of direct and indirect employment. The expectation of Sondelani is that twelve additional FTEs will be recruited, of which four men and eight women. Of these twelve FTE, six employees will perform basic work, four employees work at medium level and two employees work at a high level. In addition, there is a growth in indirect employment with an estimated three hundred FTEs. This concerns work at basic level.

Increasing the strenght of production Due to the expansion, the size of the hatcheries can be greatly increased in the coming years. Due to the increased capacity, turnover and profit are expected to increase sharply.

Sharing of knowledge, skills and techniques
The exporter indicates that the poultry sector is an industry in
which a small-scale business can be started relatively easily. With
only 500 chickens, which require a relatively small initial
investment, it can already be started.
